A key highlight has been the forging of new partnerships with Indigenous groups and agencies. These collaborations have deepened our ability to offer culturally relevant services and furthered our dedication to reconciliation. We are honored to walk this path alongside our Indigenous partners, acknowledging that mental health support must reflect the diversity and richness of our community.

In our efforts to build long-term sustainability, we have prioritized succession planning at all levels of the organization. Preparing our teams for future leadership ensures the continuity of our mission and strengthens our capacity to serve.

We faced record shelter usage and the longest waitlist for housing we've ever seen. This allowed clients to access both mental health support and essential services in one place. We are proud to have served over 1,800 clients in our low-threshold programs—our highest number yet—and provided more than 500 hours of training to our community and staff.

Throughout the year, we stood in solidarity through initiatives like the Pride Walk, Black History Month, and numerous health promotion days. These moments were about more than raising awareness; they were about demonstrating our commitment to breaking down stigma and fostering inclusivity.


